- (c) She was neat, wrinkled woman of forty with an uncertain temper. Her husband was continually fretting at the hardships she imposed on him, especially at certain galling incidents which wounded his vanity.
  - (d) Now and then we would see her in one of the downstairs windows like the carved torso of an idol in a niche. Looking or not looking at us, we could never tell which. Thus she passed from generation to generation—dear, inescapable, impervious, tranquil and perverse.
  - (e) I do not believe I am a vindictive man but when immortal gods take a hand in the matter, it is pardonable to observe the result with complacency.
  - (f) The advantage of advancing years lies in discovering that traditions are true, and therefore, alive, indeed a tradition is not even traditional except when it is alive.
